Service Learning Opportunities in a Social Science Course: Hong Kong

Project/Course Objectives

- To practice sociological methods and techniques by conducting sociological interviews, surveys and writing up reports.
- To develop empathy for their clients with whom they have to form friendships during the research projects.

Inquiry Based Learning Activities

- Students offered English/computer skills classes to migrants, became "big buddies" to disabled companions and visited disadvantaged youths in public housing estates.
- Students were required to go off campus to conduct interviews with different people (e.g. new immigrants, the disabled, the elderly, and community activists).
- Students learned to take positions or responsibility for their clients and exercised their leadership skills. They were required to organize basic skills classes, provide counseling for drug abusers and be responsible for helping a disabled person for a day.

How did you assess the effectiveness of students' learning?

Student groups have two deliverables for this project:

(i) A 10-15 page report based on a set of questions, e.g. for the Disability project


These questions were supplemented with an additional question asking student groups to reflect on and evaluate their experience of the project as a whole.
